**Art Twenty One**, a group exhibition that explores contemporary notions of fantasy in an interconnected global environment held on June 29.

It was a lovely showpiece of painting, photography, sculpture, and collage as artists defined alternative ways of depicting otherness, not rooted in spatial boundaries but by instability, fluidity, and cross-cultural assimilation.

Exhibitors at the event included, **Joseph Eze** and **Demola Ogunajo's** who's paintings adopt cultural references that span time periods and geographies, from mythical characters to street fashion and contemporary mass culture.

**Namsa Leuba's** whose photographs examine the representation of African identity through the Western imagination, combining an anthropological interest in ancient ceremonial structures with an aesthetic that is informed by fashion and design sensibilities.

**Abraham Oghobase** who questions the socio-economic histories of African wax fabrics, inserting his own body within fictive scenarios.

**Paa Joe** and **Jacob TettehAshong** created spectacular coffins in the form of consumer goods that speak to the aspirations and values of their intended users and other exhibitors.
